Mr. Johnson provided a brief summary of the MASB Annual Leadership Conference, sharing insights from the General Sessions and Delegate Assembly.

MASB 2023 Annual Leadership Conference Reports

Resolution Authorizing Participation in Schools of Choice

Superintendent McGilvery stated the Schools of Choice application window is scheduled for January 8–19, 2024. Limited space is available in all grade levels at Carman-Ainsworth High School; Carman-Ainsworth Middle School; Dillon Elementary in grades K-3; Dye Elementary in grades 2-3; Randels Elementary in grades K-5; and Rankin Elementary in grades K-5.

Motion by Cousins, supported by Handy, to opt into the State Schools of Choice Program Section 105 of the State School Aid Act for the second semester of the 2023-2024 school year on a limited basis at Carman-Ainsworth High School; Carman-Ainsworth Middle School; Dillon Elementary in grades K-3; Dye Elementary in grades 2-

Resolution to Hold in Abeyance Board Policy 6320 – Purchasing

Assistant Superintendent Russ Parks stated the district is in immediate need to purchase a Condensate Return/Storage Tank for Carman-Ainsworth Middle School at a price that is estimated to be over the state bid limit of \$29,572.00. It is an emergency situation because the current Condensate Return/Storage Tank is in desperate need of immediate replacement, which will not allow the district to follow the formal bidding process. Information obtained regarding replacement of this specialized piece of equipment has determined that it is not readily available and would need to be ordered and will take a minimum of ten (10) weeks to receive. Assistant Superintendent Parks noted the condition of the current Condensate Return/Storage Tank is precarious and could fail at any time, leaving the middle school without heat. Assistant Superintendent Parks recommends the Board hold in abeyance Board Policy 6320 – Purchasing, with regard to the purchase of a Condensate Return/Storage Tank, rather than utilizing the formal bid process.

Motion by Cousins, supported by Handy, in support of the Resolution to Hold in Abeyance Board Policy 6320 – Purchasing pertaining to the purchase of a Condensate Return/Storage Tank for Carman-Ainsworth Middle School, as recommended by Assistant Superintendent Parks.

Brief discussion ensued.

- Mrs. Fields noted staff, students, and families district-wide are participating in school climate surveys to
 anonymously assess the perceived school climate. Data from the surveys will be used to set building and
 district goals to enhance positive behavior supports. Mrs. Fields noted The Learning Community is
 participating in the Multi-Tiered Systems of Support (MTSS) process and is building interventions for our
 littlest learners.
- Mr. Parks shared the Athletic Department has added two activities, Freshman Cheer and Junior Varsity Bowling. Mr. Parks voiced appreciation to the Board of Education for their support during the recent election and shared polling results.
- Superintendent McGilvery thanked administrators, staff, students, families, and Board Members for supporting the district in the recent millage proposal passage. Superintendent McGilvery is participating in the UM-Flint Critical Issues Conference in the spring and taped a video promotion. The goal of the conference is to provide a platform to bring together educators to critically consider the profound impact of Generative AI on education and society.

- Ms. Nealy also attended the Halls of Halloween at the middle school, which was well organized and a fun activity. Ms. Nealy voiced appreciation to Superintendent McGilvery and district staff for the many hours contributed to the passing of the millage proposal.
- Superintendent Koegel congratulated Ms. Nealy who was recognized at the MASB Annual Leadership Conference for receiving the MASB President's Award. Superintendent Koegel attended the middle school play which was very well done and noted the high school play is scheduled for this weekend.
